The COVID-19 global pandemic gave rise to significant changes in the University operation. Online teaching and learning, online assessment and Pass/Fail grading (not contributing to GPA) were made available to undergraduate and/or taught postgraduate students in the academic years 2019-2020, 2020-2021 and 2021-2022.

C. Degree Structure of Undergraduate and Taught Postgraduate Curricula

Since September 1998, the University has adopted the credit unit system for all undergraduate curricula (except BDS, MBBS, BNurs(Full-time/Up to 2001/02) and BNurs(Part-time/Up to 2011/12)). "Credit units" are the weight assigned to each course relative to the total study load under a degree curriculum. The number of credits is normally indicative of the contact hours, study time and/or student workload associated with the course. Students who satisfactorily complete courses with a credit value earn the credits of those courses. A student shall normally complete not less than 160 credits of courses in a 3-year Full-time undergraduate programme, or not less than 240 credits of courses in a 4-year Full-time undergraduate programme, in the manner specified in the syllabus.

The University has adopted the credit unit system for all taught postgraduate curricula (see category 10 under Section A) with effect from the 2016/17 intake. The total study loads of individual curricula are specified in the syllabus.

Semester (or Year) Grade Point Average (GPA) is the combined grade average of all courses attempted by students (including failed courses) during a given semester, where each course is given a weight, normally equal to its credit-unit value.

Cumulative GPA is the combined grade average of all courses attempted by a candidate (failed courses are excluded until 2009/10 intake) at the time of calculation, where each course is given a weight, normally equal to its credit-unit value.

Graduation GPA is the GPA in respect of courses attempted by a candidate (including failed courses) at the point of graduation. For undergraduate students in the 2017-18 intake and thereafter who have successfully completed six Common Core courses, the calculation of Graduation GPA is subject to the proviso that either five Common Core courses with the higher Graduation GPA (covering all four Areas of Inquiry), or all six courses will be counted towards Graduation GPA, depending on which generates the higher Graduation GPA.

Weighted GPA is the combined grade average of all courses taken by students weighted by factors (such as the level of the courses) defined by the Board of the Faculty.

Full-year Course For a full-year course which extends from Semester 1 to Semester 2, assessment is reported ONLY ONCE at the end of Semester 2.

Re-assessment When a course is re-assessed or repeated, both the original and new grades are recorded on the transcript. Credits are granted only once for each course regardless of the number of times a course may be taken.

Advanced Standing For credits gained in other institutions, only those formally recognized by the University are recorded on the transcripts of regular HKU students. Details of courses taken elsewhere are not shown, and credits granted for such courses are not normally included in the calculation of the GPA. In May 2014, Senate approved that advanced standing may be granted to candidates in recognition of studies completed successfully before admission to the curriculum. With effect from 2022-23, advanced standing and the ceiling of 120 credits should apply only to recognition of prior studies completed successfully before admission to the University. For internal transfers effective from 2022-23, the relevant Faculty Board shall determine the number of credits that can be transferred, which shall not be subject to a ceiling, and that all such credits shall be included in the calculation of the GPA (unless the courses are not subject to the University's grade point system or have been approved by the Senate to adopt a special grading system).

Credit Transfer The number of transferred credits granted for courses completed at other institutions at any time during the student's candidature may be recorded on the transcript, but the results of such courses shall not be included in the calculation of the GPA.

D. Degree Rankings For students admitted to the full-time 3-year undergraduate curriculum in 2012/13, a degree ranking which shows the percentage of students awarded the same category of honours classification will be shown on transcript. Students from all cohorts (regardless of the admission year) graduating with the same degree curriculum in the same year would be ranked together. Only the percentage of the student's own class of honours (and above) will be shown. The degree rankings are calculated once a year 15 days after the latest date for release of final year examination results and honours classification. The rankings are a "snapshot" of student performance on the day of calculation and the figures will not be changed.
