EXPLANATIONS

The University

City University of Hong Kong was founded in 1984 as the City Polytechnic of Hong Kong. From 1994, the name of the institution was changed to City University of Hong Kong. The University is funded by the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region.

Structure of Research Degree and Professional Doctorate Programmes

Research degree and professional doctorate programmes consist of both coursework and independent research studies culminating in the submission of a thesis. To fulfill the coursework requirements, students are normally required to take a prescribed set of courses. Some professional doctorate programmes offer intermediate awards such as master's degrees. These awards have the following classifications: "Distinction", "Credit" and "Pass".

Credit Units

Each course is assigned a number of credit units. A credit unit is earned by approximately forty to fifty hours of student work.

Grades

A student's level of performance in a course is indicated by the following grades. Some courses are graded on a pass-fail basis.
