Dear Chris,

We are pleased to offer you a Summer Vacation Scholarship with the Children's Medical Research Institute (CMRI). Scholarships are awarded to enable interested undergraduate students to undertake a period of research training under the continuous supervision of a Research leader or their delegate. This agreement is based on the following terms.

**1 Position**

- 1.1 You will be granted access to CMRI premises as a Summer Student.
- 1.2 When you perform the duties at CMRI, you will report to Fiona Yang, Research Officer, Gene Therapy.
- 1.3 During your stay with the Institute, you will be paid a student stipend of \$2,500.

**2 Terms of Scholarship**

- 2.1 Your Summer Student access will commence on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2023 to 25<sup>th</sup> December 2023 and 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2024 to 16<sup>th</sup> February 2024.
- 2.2 The duration of the Scholarship is for a period of no less than six (6) weeks or more than thirteen (13) weeks. Where a Scholarship includes the Christmas/New Year holiday period and the applicant intends to take some leave in addition to the public holidays, the institute must be notified of the length of his leave on commencement of the scholarship. Any additional days taken outside the public holidays will not be paid.
- 2.3 This Scholarship does not imply an employee/employer relationship and, as such, the Children's Medical Research Institute does not pay for workers compensation insurance cover nor superannuation guarantee levy. As your tax liability is dependent on your particular circumstances, we suggest you check this with the Australian Taxation Office or a Tax Advisor.
- 2.4 Any human or animal research projects are required to have the necessary ethics clearance before research is undertaken.

**3 CMRI policies and procedures**

- 3.1 You are expected to comply with all CMRI's policies and procedures as amended from time to time.
- 3.2 On commencement, and at all times during, your time at CMRI you are directed to familiarise yourself and comply with all policies and procedures established by CMRI from time to time.
