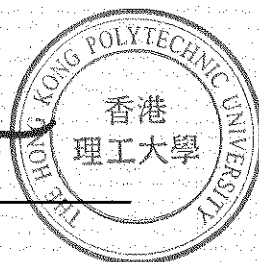

4. Qualifying GPA

$$\text{Qualifying GPA} = \frac{\sum \text{Subject Grade Point} \times \text{Subject Credit Value}}{\sum \text{Subject Credit Value}}$$

Qualifying GPA is the result of the accumulated value of the subject grade point multiplied by the subject credit value divided by the total credit value for the subjects within the programme credit requirement. It is capped at 4.00 before 2020-21. From 2020-21 onwards, it is not capped, and the highest value is 4.30.

For retaken subject, only the grade obtained in the final attempt will be included in the calculation. Grades obtained through credit transfer will also be taken into consideration.

5. Credits Attained

The Credits Attained only take into consideration those credits which are relevant for contributing to the award being pursued by a student.

6. Medium of Instruction
