**Session:** Academic Year in which the course was taken

**Class Title:** Code and title of the course

**Credit Value:** Credit points of the course. Full time students normally take 120 credit points per session at undergraduate level and 180 credit points in a 12 month period at taught postgraduate level

**Grading System:** Grades obtained in prescribed assessments are shown overleaf. From 1992 to September 2014 the University used the **Common Assessment Scale (CAS)** which comprised 21 discrete points, numbered from 0-20. From September 2014 the University introduced the **Common Grading Scale (CGS)**, a 23-point alphanumeric scale where A1 represents the top grade that can be achieved. Each grade correlates to an associated grade point. From September 2020, unrounded grade points are released.

Full details on the University's Code of Practice on Assessment can be found on the University's website.

Both CAS marks and CGS grades are grouped into seven bands as detailed below:

CAS 9/CGS D3 represent the minimum level of performance normally needed for credit to be awarded for an individual course towards an undergraduate degree or postgraduate qualification

RP denotes a pass grade for a postgraduate taught resit assessment and RF denotes a failing grade for a postgraduate taught resit assessment

NP (No Paper) indicates that work for that course was not completed and no credit is awarded

WITHHELD indicates that the student was not eligible to undertake the final assessment for the course

Merit Certificates indicate that the student has completed the work of a course at an 'outstanding' (1st class) or 'very good' (2nd class) level. This equates to CAS 20-18/CGS A1-A5 and CAS 17-15/CGS B1-B3 respectively

As a consequence of the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on the second half session of the 2019/20 academic year, for courses undertaken at levels 1 and 2 during this time, results are not available. Where students have achieved a course, this will be recorded as the credit associated with the courses having been achieved, with no grade listed.
